Hello everyone,

Last time we looked at vitamin A so let's have a look at vitamin C today. Most people are familiar with this vitamin and will easily identify at least one food where it is found, but sometimes it's good to revise, just going over some old ground and we might come across something we had forgotten or even learn something new.

Alright let us get it out of the way, yes, citrus fruit is a good source of vitamin C, oranges, tangerines, grapefruit etc. Some other foods in this list are rose hip, strawberries, guavas, papayas, kiwifruit, tomatoes, peppers, blackcurrants, broccoli, Brussels sprouts and surprisingly, potatoes.

Vitamin C is needed in the body for the growth and repair of all body tissues, its work includes helping with the healing of wounds and the maintenance of teeth and bones.

We are told that vitamin C is part of a group of vitamins which are water soluble, that means that it dissolves in water so unfortunately cannot be stored in the body but some amount needs to be taken into the body every day.

When cooking foods containing water soluble vitamins, it is best to use as little water as possible as there is the likely hood of the vitamins being transferred to the water and often being thrown down the sink. A good practice is to reuse the cooking liquor (water) in gravies, stews, soups or sometimes, it just makes a pleasant drink.

In reviewing the different vitamins, we are led to look closely at a wide variety of fresh fruit and vegetables, so really, we don't have to worry about any individual vitamin but just to include many different fruit and vegetables in our diets regularly.

Best of all we need to remember 1 Corinthians 10:31 Whether therefore ye eat or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God

Fruit and vegetables were given to us for food from the beginning at creation.

“behold I have given you every herb bearing seed ... and every tree, in the which is the fruit ...” Genesis 1:29

Despised, downcast, debased, deprived, segregated and lonely, the woman at the well. She went to fetch water at an awkward time, thinking 'there's nobody who will be interfering in my business as nobody is interested in my problems anyway'. This was her daily usual hour, I suppose, as it seemed just perfect for her to do the well trip peacefully.

This particular day was a special day as she lifted her eyes and noticed a man, Jesus, who came to ask for water to drink. Very strange though as there was no such communication between the Samaritans and the Jewish people. She marvelled in disbelief as she sensed the difference in character of this particular Jew. She might have smiled in her heart, a feeling of being worthy to be alive. A kind loving voice in her ears made her face glow.

The thoughts in her mind lingered, am I that important to be approached by a Jew, not only a Jew but a Jewish man? Are there people still out there who regard me as a valuable being? Are my hands capable of drawing water for a Jewish gentleman? She might have felt like a lady once more.

She gathered up some courage to open her mouth and replied "how is it that thou, being a Jew, ask a drink of me, which am a woman of Samaria? Jews had no dealings with the Samaritans" John 4 : 9.

To her surprise, the soft voice answered and promised her to never be thirsty again if she accepted the living water to be given her. She was amazed by this statement. Does this man care about me this much that he even promises to give me living water that I thirst no more?

It was too much for her to contain, such that she left her water pot in haste and ran to the village to share this good news about the stranger who is kind enough to supply them with living water. John 4 :28-30 "...come and see a man..."

Prophecy, Perseverance and Prayer

In this chapter we see Daniel holding a high position in the government of the Medes and Persians. Although in an important position, he obviously ensures he spends time studying the scriptures. From his studies of Jeremiah, Daniel realised that the prophesied 70 years that Judah was to be in captivity was almost at an end. From this we should learn that we should never be too busy to study God's word (Matthew 6:33). Another important issue is that Daniel did not just read the scriptures he studied carefully enough to ensure he understood what was meant (2 Timothy 2:15).

With the end of the prophecy in mind, Daniel began to pray and confess his sins and those of his people. Daniel's prayer is one of the best examples of an intercessory prayer recorded in the bible. It was without blame or accusation but instead Daniel acknowledged the faults and claimed the promises of the scriptures. Daniel's confessions also showed his faith in God and total dependence on Him to do what was right.

Whilst making his earnest requests to God, the angel Gabriel was sent. His mission was to help Daniel understand many things including the prophecy previously mentioned in Daniel 8. The 2300 day prophecy (Daniel 8:14-26) had been partially explained to Daniel by Gabriel. Now many years later in chapter 9 Gabriel was sent in answer to Daniel's prayer to give him the skill and understanding of the prophecy. Gabriel also delivered the message that he (Daniel) was greatly loved and from the beginning of his prayer requests the command had been given to go to Daniel.

So, what are some of the things we can learn from Daniel 9?

1. Gabriel explained in Daniel 9:25 when the 2300-day prophecy would start and all the other prophecies that were a part of that period. The start is from the decree given to rebuild Jerusalem (Ezra 7:1-27). This verse would have also given Daniel the assurance that his people would go back home and that Jerusalem would be rebuilt.

2. In Daniel 9:24 Gabriel outlined the seventy-week prophecy that was the first part of the 2300 days prophecy. With all the Daniel time prophecies a day for a year principle must be applied (Ezekiel 4:6). Using the start date already given Gabriel outlined a number of important parts of the prophecy. These included the time for Jerusalem to be rebuilt, when Jesus would start His public ministry (His baptism), when He would be crucified and also the time when the gospel would start to be preached to the gentiles.

Generally, Daniel chapter 9 shows the love God has for His people both corporately and as individuals. God cares so much that He reveals things to us before they happen so that we can trust and love Him. All that we need to do is trust His sure word of prophecy, persevere and pray, just as Daniel did.

Bricklayer Accident Report

The following letter is from a professional bricklayer, in response to his worker's compensation claim for injuries sustained on the job. It seems the insurer sought more detailed information for their accident investigation, about how the bricklayer sustained such substantial injuries.

Dear Sir

I am writing in response to your request for additional information in Block 3 of the accident report form. I put "Poor planning" as the cause of my accident. You asked for a fuller explanation and I trust the following details will be sufficient.

I am a bricklayer by trade. On the day of the accident, I was working alone on the roof of a new six-story building. When I completed my work, I found I had some bricks left over, which, when weighed later were found to be slightly in excess of 500lbs. Rather than carry the bricks down by hand, I decided to lower them in a barrel by using a pulley, which was attached to the side of the building on the sixth floor. Securing the rope at ground level, I went up to the roof, swung the barrel out and loaded the bricks into it. Then I went down and untied the rope, holding it tightly to ensure a slow descent of the bricks. You will note in Block 11 of the accident report form that I weigh 135lbs.

Due to my surprise at being jerked off the ground so suddenly, I lost my presence of mind and forgot to let go of the rope. Needless to say, I proceeded at a rapid rate up the side of the building. In the vicinity of the third floor, I met the barrel which was now proceeding downward at an equally impressive speed. This explains the fractured skull, minor abrasions and the broken collarbone, as listed in Section 3 of the accident report form.

Slowed only slightly, I continued my rapid ascent, not stopping until the fingers of my right hand were two knuckles deep into the pulley.

Fortunately by this time I had regained my presence of mind and was able to hold tightly to the rope, in spite of the excruciating pain I was now beginning to experience. At approximately the same time, however, the barrel of bricks hit the ground and the bottom fell out of the barrel. Now devoid of the weight of the bricks, that barrel weighed approximately 50 lbs. I refer you again to my weight of 135 pounds.

As you might imagine, I began a Rapid descent, down the side of the building. In the vicinity of the third floor, I met the barrel coming up. This accounts for the two fractured ankles, broken tooth and severe lacerations of my legs and lower body. Here my luck began to change slightly. The encounter with the barrel seemed to slow me enough to lessen my injuries when I fell into the pile of bricks and fortunately only three vertebrae were cracked.

I am sorry to report, however, as I lay there on the pile of bricks, in pain, unable to move, I again lost my composure and presence of mind and let go of the rope and I lay there watching the empty barrel begin its journey back down onto me. This explains the two broken legs.

I hope this answers your inquiry as to my "poor planning".

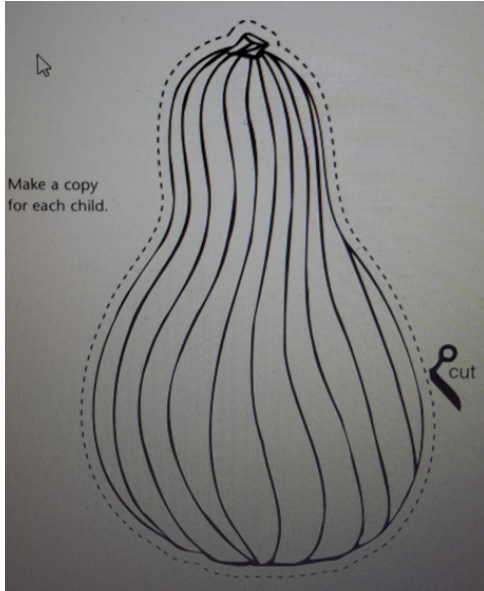
"For I will surely show you kindness" (2 Samuel 9:7, NIV).

1 medium	Onion
2 small	Carrots
2 medium	Potatoes
1 medium	Clove of Garlic
2 tbs	Cooking oil
125g	Garden/edamame Peas
1	Vegetable stock cube
2 tbs	Plain flour
