Stay Down!

I do not know where we were coming from that day. Perhaps my elder brother, Leslie, a few cousins and I were coming back from swimming as we often do in one of the nearby rivers to where we lived in Mitchells Hill, Clarendon in Jamaica. It could have been that we were out shooting, trapping birds, fishing, or exploring the vast area around where we lived, seeking new adventures.

On our way home, we decided that we would take a short cut through our Gran's coffee plantation, not just because it was much quicker than taking the other way home, but because we knew that in the coffee plantation there were sweetsops, orange trees, star apples and many other fruit which we so loved.

There we were, walking along, but this time I was in front and everyone were lagging behind me, for a change. I decided that I was going to have some fun, I had seen Tarzan on Mr Hollings' TV swinging from tree to tree on a vine and making a ridiculous noise and I decided that I was going to do the same. In the absence of a vine, I decided that I would climb on one of the coffee trees, shout like Tarzan and launch myself horizontally from that Coffee tree to another that was nearby.

Well, I executed the first phase of my ingenious plan with perfect athletic agility and dexterity. Before I knew it, I was up in the tree shouting like Tarzan, and launching myself with my arms outstretched, reaching for the other coffee tree, anticipating that the last phase of my manoeuvre would be as flawless as the first.

To be honest with you, it was not until my face kissed the ground that I considered that the last phase of my manoeuvre was most probably inadequately executed, to say the least! I was stunned for a moment and my brother and my cousins just passed me by, totally un-phased by what had happened, as if this were the kind of thing, they expected me to do.

My Brother, Leslie, uttered just eight words as he was passing by, "Stay down the wasps are over your head." Well I was not going to be left behind, that coffee plantation was a dark and scary place, so I ignored him and started to get up. To the wasps, my movement was like waving a red flag in front of a bull and they stung me, on my right eyelid. In a short while that eyelid was so swollen, I could not see out of my right eye.

"Stay down, the wasps are over your head." If I had listened to my brother, if I had "stayed down" and watched and waited for the wasps to go about their business, and leave me alone, I would not have suffered the excruciating pain which they inflicted on me. There is wisdom in listening to good instructions, but we must also follow through and do that which we are convinced to be the right actions to take.

Jesus referring to the Holy Spirit said, "And when He has come, He will convict the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment: of sin, because they do not believe in Me; of righteousness, because I go to My Father and you see Me no more; of judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged. John 16:8-11, NKJV.

Daniel 8

When reading Daniel chapter 8, one of the first things to notice is the vast amount of information given here. The best way to deal with this chapter is to divide it into four sections. Verses 1 to 12 is about what Daniel saw, verses 13 and 14 is about what Daniel heard, verses 15 to 25 the interpretation of the vision by Gabriel and verses 26 and 27 are the interruption of the interpretation. The interpretation of chapter 8 is completed in chapter 9.

The first and the third portions are best dealt with together. Daniel in his vision saw a ram charging west, north and south with two large horns, but one horn was higher than the other. Next a male goat with a significant single horn between the eyes, was seen heading at speed towards the ram. The goat charged with great fury and knocked down and trampled the powerless ram. The goat grew stronger but at the height of its power the huge horn broke off and four little horns grew pointing in four different directions.

One of the four horns next grew a small horn which grew bigger and stronger than the four combined. This new horn grew so strong that it did many terrible things including challenging the power of heaven and trampled on the people of God. This was all permitted by God because of the sins of His people.

The meaning of the animal symbols is explained in Daniel 8:20-21. The ram represented Media Persia and the male goat represented Greece. The great horn between the goat's eyes represented the first king (Alexander the Great), which after he died four notable horns represented the generals who divided the kingdom. Verse 22 makes it clear that none of these four generals would ever be as powerful as the first king of Greece.

In verse 9 of the passage a little horn was seen to grow out of one of the four horns. This little horn in verse 10 was said to grow strong and challenge the power of heaven and trample the people of God. Verse 23 gives more information and characteristics of the little horn. It is these characteristics that allow us to identify the little horn from the history books as initially pagan (Imperial) Rome and later papal Rome.

In verse 12 the prospering of the little horn referred to the way papal Rome encouraged God's people to look to the pope and priests for salvation instead of God. As we know from the prophecy of Daniel 7 papal Rome was allowed to succeed for 1260 years. Many people and nations came under its control due to craft and policy. Unlike the other reigning kingdoms, Papal Rome was a mighty religious political entity which cause much suffering and deception.

The main feature in Daniel chapter 8 is verse 14 which talks about a 2300-day prophecy. It was due to misunderstandings about this prophecy that eventually led to the establishment of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. The part of the interpretation that was interrupted in verses 26 and 27 that relates to the prophecy is explained in chapter 9.

We can learn many things from chapter 8. Firstly, God cares enough to send Gabriel to explain, what would happen to his people down through the ages. Secondly when Daniel became sick and found the whole thing too much to bear God allowed the interpretation to be paused and completed in chapter 9.

Finally, God foretold what would happen through the ages to His people, so that we would believe and not be afraid. What a mighty God we serve.

Job 2: 11-13.

Upon learning about the doom that had befallen Job, his three friends were filled with compassion. They were moved by this terrifying story and arranged to pay him a visit.

The three travellers motives were soon dyed with disappointment as they saw their noble friend covered in sores and ashes. He was beyond recognition. Their hearts were marred with questions, what might he have done in secret that God is punishing him like this? They joined him in mourning but it didn't take long before they started encouraging him to repent of his private sins. The inquisition took place and one by one they took turns to find out his hidden wickedness.

The consolation visit was soon over as they concluded that their friend had committed a serious sin.

The poor man was lonely although in the midst of his beloved friends. A burden shared had worsened the pain. All those who were close to him became the devil's instruments to afflict him even more. Job's self explanation was deemed as self justification Job 32: 1,2) They insisted that he needed to repent. Is this the way we should support one another?

The All Seeing God: Job 42: 7-9. Job's attention was drawn from his friends to God who sees and knows all matters of the heart. There's nothing as painful as being

judged by those who are meant to be sympathising with you. In all of this Job was on his own except for God to lift his head up.

He opened his mouth in desperation as he enquired about what seemed not to be right, Job 3: 1-11. He regretted being born. He concluded that this life was volatile, yet in all this he remained faithful to God. Job 10:1,2. Isn't it amazing that God allows us to, pour out our heavily burdened hearts unto Him? Job 3: 12-26; Matthew 17: 28.

A Limp for Joy

God's timing is always perfect. He is never slack in His promises. He knew that Job was His faithful servant. God allowed the devil to test Job's faith and he knew when to set the boundaries. He ended it!. The humble man's health was restored. All his wealth and possessions were reinstated and multiplied. I'm certain God spared his wife's life to witness this too.

Ten other children were born to Job; a consolation for the ones he lost. Even though Job was "wounded" he was at the first stage of recovering and would still hold the pain of what he had gone through in his journey to life restoration. I believe with time his grieving heart would be healed and he would limp no more.

His friends and other people came to visit to witness his new beginning. The visiting guests brought gifts of gold and other valuables, making him even richer. (Job 42: 11.) Job's end was greater than his beginning. Job 42: 12,13.

Opportunity is given to us to witness and to extend God's ministry despite our circumstances. Job's story is a good example, I believe many including his own wife, turned to God. His three friends who once judged him wrongly might have been spared also to witness God's mighty hand of restoration.

PART II SIN, SUFFERING AND A SAVIOUR

1. What is the origin of sin and suffering? Did the angels have anything to do with it?

Read Isaiah 14:12-14, Revelation 12:7-9 and Luke 10:18.

Lucifer was created as a beautiful angel of light but he became proud and wanted God's position and power. He was successful in convincing some of the angels that God was unjust. In Revelation 12:3, 4 we are told that one third of the angels sided with Lucifer. As a result, he and his angels were cast out of heaven, and he became known as satan or the devil. Sin, disobedience to God, originated with the angel Lucifer.

2. Why didn't God just destroy Lucifer and the fallen angels from the time they rebelled?

Read 1 Corinthians 4:9 and 1 Corinthians 6: 2, 3.

When we consider the fact that God is love (see I John 4:8) and He is longsuffering, merciful, gracious and abundant in goodness and truth (see Exodus 34:6) it is clear that He would not want anyone to serve Him out of fear. Therefore, as the Bible says in I Corinthians 4:9, God is allowing His angels and all humanity to see the evil effects of sin so they will know that He is justified when the devil and his demons are finally destroyed.

Like us, the devil and his angels must also face judgement. God is following the same principle he laid out for us in Deuteronomy 19:16-19.

3. How did sin spread to our planet and its inhabitants? Read Genesis 3: 1-5

Lucifer, now known as the devil, tempted our forefathers using the same lie that he did while in heaven. He convinced them that God was preventing them from being as wise and powerful as He is. Eve, then Adam, fell into his trap and thus sin and suffering were ushered into this world and into the human race. But, because of His great love for us, God had already developed a plan to save us and restore us to our original sinless state. We see the first glimpse of this plan in the promise of a Saviour as foreshadowed to Adam and Eve in Genesis 3: 15. The angels now, in love and obedience to Him, cooperate with God as His heavenly messengers as He seeks to restore mankind to Himself.

PART III THE LOVE OF GOD

1. How exactly did God plan to restore us to Himself? Read John 3:16, Romans 5: 8 and 2 Corinthians 5: 21

What a love! Think of the person you love more than anyone or anything in this world. Your love for that person may be deep and intense. God's love for you is much deeper and even more intense than that! Amazing! It is because He loves us so much that He gave His only Son Jesus to die on our behalf. Jesus took the punishment that should have been ours. Only the sinless Son of God could do this on our behalf. He loves us that much. Through His death we can be eternally restored to God and live with Him once again.

2. Do I have to do something to be restored to God? Read John 1: 12, I John 1: 9, and Acts 3: 19

In Ephesians 2: 8, we are told that we are saved by God's grace. It is His amazing grace fueled by His intense love for us that caused Him to send His Son to save us. This gift of salvation is God's free gift to us. All we need to do is accept it and admit that we are sinners in need of His forgiveness. Then He re-creates us to become like Him.

He begins a work in us whereby He shapes our thought and desire to be like His. (See Philippians 1: 6) We just have to daily surrender our lives to Him.

3. Do the angels have a role to play in saving us?

The angels themselves cannot save us but they are very interested in our salvation. God employs them to assist in His overall plan to save us.

- i) It was an angel who told Mary that she would give birth to the baby Jesus. Luke 1: 28-35
- ii) It was angels who alerted the world to the birth of Jesus. Luke 2: 8-15
- iii) It was an angel who appeared to Joseph in a dream and told him to take baby Jesus and Mary to Egypt to prevent King Herod from killing Jesus and also when they should leave Egypt. Matthew 2: 13, 20
- iv) It was angels who came and helped Jesus after the devil tempted Him in the wilderness. Matthew 4: 11
- v) It was an angel who comforted and strengthened Jesus during His suffering in the Garden of Gethsemane. Luke 22: 43
- vi) It was an angel who rolled the stone away from Jesus' tomb and told the women that He had risen from the dead. Matthew 28:2-7
- vii) It was angels who assured the disciples that Jesus will return to the earth the same way He was taken up into heaven. Acts 1: 9-11
- viii) Angels will accompany Jesus when He comes to take us to heaven. Matthew 16:27

The angels are not just watching God's mighty acts to save us but they cooperate with Him and are actively involved in the process.

- 4. Do the angels also help us?
- i) Angels surround and protect the people of God. Psalm 34: 7 and Psalm 91: 11,12
- ii) The angels minister to us and serve us. Hebrews 1: 13, 14
- iii) The angels rejoice when we accept Jesus as our personal Saviour. Luke 15: 10

God loves us with such an incomprehensible love that He employs all of His Heavenly resources to save us. It is our prayer that you will accept His sacrifice on your behalf and be saved in His eternal Kingdom.

Conclusion

We hope that this Bible study has been a means of starting you on the road to becoming acquainted or re-acquainted with our loving Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. How many cups did the jug hold? That's just like our story today about a widow who had just a little cooking oil in her oil jar, but her jar didn't get empty.





50g Brown Sugar

100g Sesame seeds

175g Oats

50g Walnuts

Grease and line square baking pan with baking paper
