Let's have a look at the children of Israel in captivity, their freedom was curtailed. They were forced to live in a foreign country, their normal lives were disrupted, changed forever.

Daniel and his three friends especially spring to mind, they did not sit around feeling sorry for themselves, but were determined to serve God come what may. The whole book of Daniel is full of references to this fact.

I think there is someone else that is often overlooked too. The little captive maid of 2 Kings who told her mistress that the prophet in Samaria could cure her master of leprosy. This led to Naaman's healing.

This is what we call making the best of the situation, even a bad situation. This is exactly what we need to learn to do.

I think we should look at Paul, formerly Saul, he was full of zeal both before and after conversion when he suffered many beatings, imprisonments and bonds, but was determined to continue witnessing. His wish was that those who heard him should be like him (Christians) without the bonds, with which he was afflicted at the time.

Paul and Silas prayed and sang while in prison with spectacular results and the conversion of the keeper,

It could be that we relate more closely to Paul because he suffered house arrest and maybe that is how we view lockdown. Yet even worse than house arrest though, John was exiled on the isle of Patmos which HAS to be worse than lockdown. We are in lockdown for our own protection, for our own good. John was being punished for witnessing. He was on a whole island all alone. Not in a house in a street with neighbours all around as we are.

We have looked at worthy examples of how to cope in our strange and prolonged situation. All those mentioned above were of course following the example of Jesus so what we need to do now is to follow the same example. Make the best of the situation, witnessing where and when we can and praying without ceasing. 1 Thessalonians 5.

What A Mighty God We Serve!

Daniel Chapter 7 is one of the most interesting and debated chapters in the bible. In this chapter Daniel received a night vision from God which contained creatures that could easily be found in a modern science fiction movie.

The first creature was a lion with eagle's wings, then a bear raised up on one side with three ribs in its mouth. The next was a leopard with four heads and wings and the final creature that was said to be terrible and strong with iron teeth. It was also said to stamp and trample on things. It had ten horns and after some time three horns were uprooted by a stout little horn that had eyes and a mouth that spoke blasphemous things.

The vision contained a judgement scene which included books being opened among many other happenings. Daniel found the whole vision disturbing and troubling. We know this because in verse 16 Daniel asked an explanation of the whole thing.

The meaning of this vision was similar to that in the Daniel chapter 2 vision. The difference was that in this chapter as in other prophetic books, the repeat and enlarge principal was employed.

Once again, the major succeeding kingdoms were outlined. Babylon, Medo Persia, Greece and Rome were still represented but by the various creatures. The repeat was the outlining of the kingdoms but the enlarge part of the prophecy was the part about the little horn.

In John 14:29 Jesus said He was revealing certain things before they happened so that when they did happen, we would believe. Daniel 7 was one of those chapters.

In this chapter we were given the kingdoms that would occur from the time of Daniel (Babylon), right down to the end of time. Another significant feature in the chapter was about the papal Rome power represented by the little horn.

So, what can we learn?

 \cdot God outlined the major kingdoms of this world that would have an effect on His people until the end, long before they came to power.

• In this chapter God foretold that papal Rome would persecute His people for a period of 1260 years.

• If we lack wisdom (James 1:5) we can ask and receive it. Daniel did not understand the vision, he asked and it was made clear to him.

• From the judgement section of the chapter we can see that Jesus is in the heavenly sanctuary interceding on our behalf.

We can learn that we have a mighty God who wants us to understand what is happening in this world so that we have faith in Him, believe and not worry.

Tempted Beyond Degree ?. Part 1

1 Corinthians 10:10-13.

Have you ever been in a situation or had a life experience where you had to conclude that all was lost? Well, ask Job.

We learn, in the Holy Bible about the man, Job, who was righteous in the eyes of God (Job 1:1). In all his ways and his daily lifestyle, God was the director of each step he took, he even offered sacrifices for his children in case they may have sinned against God. (Job1:5). At this point let us pause; this is a very important point for us, praying for our children and others avails much. (1Timothy 2:1)

Job was also known to be the richest man of his time (Job 3:3). The counting of his livestock gives us a picture of his wealth. Despite him being the richest man in his country, God still remained his number 1 priority, quite unusual compared to most rich people today. We can conclude that he was a "CELEBRITY" but yet not distracted by paparazzi or driven by fame to prove his class or to glorify himself. He was in a class by himself and remained humble in all his ways.

Pressing the red button

David and Goliath







Crackers

1	cup	Oat flour
2	cups	Plain flour
2	tsp	Salt
2	tbs	Herbs
4	tbs	Oil + 1 tbs
1	cup	Warm water

Preheat oven to 200 fan assisted oven

Mixing bowl, measuring jug, rolling pin, lined baking sheet, air-tight container

- 1. Place all the dry ingredients in the mixing bowl and mix well
- 2. Make a well (space) in the middle of the dry ingredients and add 4 tbs of oil and a third of the warm water and mix well.
- 3. Continue to add the water a little at a time until the mix forms a slightly sticky dough. **Note** you may not need all of the water in some cases more water may be needed. If you need more water wet your hand and keep kneading. Continue to knead the ingredients together until it can form a ball that does not crumble. This should take approximately 5 minutes
- 4. After a smooth pliable dough is formed roll out on a lightly floured surface to a cracker thickness.
- 5. Cut out in the desired shape and size and bake
- 6. After 7 minutes in the oven remove the crackers brush with oil sprinkle with salt and return to the oven for a further 7 minutes. Cooking times may vary.
- 7. Cool on a baking wire until cold and enjoy, store the remainder in an air-tight container.
