

This is in keeping with biblical guidance. In Philippians 4:8 we are told that whatsoever things are true, honest, just, pure, lovely, of good report if there is any virtue and if there is any praise to think on those things. In other words, we are to contemplate the positive aspects of things only and not dwell on the negatives.

Jealousy, conspiracy, trickery and general wickedness

The Bible tells us in the book of Revelation that in the last days one of the major issues is going to be about worship. The commandments also instruct us that we must remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy. But we at this time may wonder how we will ever get to a point when worshipping God will be wrong. The story of Daniel can help us to understand how this could happen.

Daniel in the position of first president over two other presidents and 120 princes was favoured due to the excellent spirit found in him. This aroused the jealousy of his colleagues, which lead to conspiracy, trickery and general wickedness.

Seeing that Daniel's colleagues could find no fault with him they decided to set a trap. The trap involved flattering the king Darius enough to persuade him to agree to a law which meant for thirty days no one could petition (worship) anyone but the king. Basically, it meant by praying to God Daniel would be breaking the law.

When Daniel knew that this decree had been signed, he went to his room, opened the windows and as usual knelt and prayed. Straight away Daniels colleagues who had been spying reported him. They also reminded the King of his decree and ensured that something was done about Daniel's apparent disobedience. When the king realised how he had been manipulated he was angry with himself but could do nothing about it. The law was clear, Daniel had to be thrown to the lions.

What can we learn from Daniel 6?

• Daniel was a man of integrity. Obedience to God was his habit and no matter what it cost him, he was going to continued praying to God (Acts 5:29).

 \cdot Daniel always had been a faithful witness for God and continued to do so even when they threw him into the lion's den. We know this

because even the King knew his God would save him. (Daniel 6:16)

• Daniel was innocent, Jesus was innocent, but people sought to destroy them both (Matthew 12:14). When we do the right thing there will be those who will try to destroy us (John 18:38).

The chapter ends with Daniel not being harmed by the lions and being protected by God. King Darius also wrote to the people of the kingdom to testify that God is the living God.

Just as it happened in Daniel's day it will happen again that false worship will be enforced and true worship will be prohibited. We can be confident however that just as God saved Daniel from the lions, we too will be saved from our adversary the roaring lion (1 Peter 5:8)

PRAYER MINISTRY

GOSHEN - God's Ordained Shepherds Hastens Eternal Nurturing

In the Holy Bible we read the story of Jacob moving to Egypt with his family (Gen.46:2-4) because of famine, for there was no food for both man and livestock in the land where he lived. (Gen.47:13).

Joseph, one of Jacob's sons, sold as a slave many years earlier (Ps.105:17) worked for the Pharaoh. Joseph was given a very high position in his office and was also on a higher rank of the hierarchy in the Egyptian government (Ps.105:21,22). This meant that he was favoured by God and man and that he was able to invite his family to come and settle in Egypt, (with Pharaoh's permission of course).

Upon arrival, Joseph, by God's wisdom, convinced the family to choose Goshen if Pharaoh was to give them an option. Joseph's kinsmen were farmers and so keepers of livestock, shepherds, so to speak. The land, Goshen seemed to be perfect (Gen.46:31-33) and fit for the purpose (Gen.47:4), as the Egyptians classed shepherds as abominable (Gen. 46:34) Goshen was therefore ideal, the best of the land. Remote with rich pastures for their flocks and away from the Egyptians

Many years and generations passed, the Pharaoh who ruled over Egypt in the time of Joseph had died and Joseph himself and many of his generation had gone to sleep (Ex.1:6). Another Pharaoh ruled over Egypt (Ex.1:8) and dealt horribly with the Israelites for he was a hard taskmaster (Ex.1:16,22). Things got nastier each day for the Children of Israel and each cloud seemed darker than the other as the days went by.

A few of the Israelites who had learned about the true God, the Creator, the living heavenly God, cried and prayed and called upon His name (Ex.2:23,24). They remembered the promise, the covenant He made with their fathers that He would never abandon them (Gen.48:3,4) and that they were His peculiar people.

The Cause Of The Agony

At the very place Goshen, God blessed and multiplied the Israelites and also their livestock. There was not one feeble soul among them (Ex.1:9).They lacked nothing and they gained everything (Ex.1:7). In Goshen God supplied, sustained and replenished (Gen.47:27).

What could the Egyptians say? Pharaoh? Jealousy, envy and malice stirred their feeble minds. Pharaoh made it possible to engage the Israelites in the most dreadful manual jobs ever performed by man (Ex.1:10-14). It went ill with the sons of Jacob, they were debased to the value of a donkey.

They stood hopelessly!.

In all these trials, God saw the afflicted, weary, wounded souls, for He is all seeing, all knowing and nothing can pass His eyes unnoticed. (Ex.2:23,24).

God's Way (Ex.2:25)

God raised a man, Moses, (of course not from the dead) who fled from Egypt (Ex.2:15) to another country, to return back to Egypt to free the Israelites from their slavery. The time came when Pharaoh had to let go of the Israelites but would not (Ex.4:23).

Many wonders were performed (Ex.11:10) to prove to Pharaoh that the God of the Israelites required His own to return to the land promised in the covenant. All sorts of plagues were poured out for the Egyptians but only the first three also fell on the Israelites (Ex.11:7). God shielded them from the rest (Ex.12:12,13)

The Morden Israelites

Although many but still the minority, the remnant will be shielded in the days to come. The plagues which will be poured upon earth will never affect (Goshen) wherever the elect dwell. Those sealed by God's seal will never taste the pains of the last 7 plagues (Rev.16) hence the cause for agony. Jealousy will be manifested in the hearts of those who will worship the beast, those who receive his mark.

Rest assured, God will take care of His own (Isa. 33:16).

Memory Verse "Samuel continued as Israel's leader all the days of his life" (1 Samuel 7:15, NIV).


The lesson story is about Samuel and how he lived for God because he listened to him. You can read the story in your Bible. It is found in 1 Samuel chapter 7.
