Distractions!

Someone told me a funny story. Now, before I share this story with you, let me confess that I cannot remember if this story is about an experience which she personally had or if it is something that was observed by one of her friends. The story goes something like this.

She arrived for her appointment at the optician and while she was waiting she saw a rather nervous looking man having his glasses fitted and the optician was constantly asking him certain questions, perhaps about if the glasses were fitted correctly, was it comfortable, and other general questions which they are accustomed to ask, just to be sure that the glasses were comfortable and fitted well.

The optician then asked if he was able to see clearly after she adjusted his glasses and cleaned the lenses. He assured her that everything was fine, the glasses were well fitted, and he could see perfectly, everything was exactly right. Having given these assurances, and still wearing his glasses, he bid the optician farewell and, in his attempt to leave the store he walked straight into the glass door!

How embarrassing that must have been for him, had he been distracted, did he not notice the glass door, we will never be able to tell. I had a similar experience not so long ago and I can assure you that it was very embarrassing. I was out and about, and I happened to come across a little shop, and I noticed that it had many interesting small figurines, ornaments, models, collectable things displayed in its window.

I was not wearing my glasses at the time but one particular object of the many on display caught my attention and I leaned forward to take a good look at it. The window was spotlessly clean and in my attempt to get a closer look, I had no idea how close I was to it until my head made contact with it resulting in a loud noise and much vibration of the window and a painful feeling in my head. I quickly tried to compose myself, as you do when you have been

embarrassed in a public setting. I looked around to see if anyone had noticed what had happened. I was so pleased that no one was in sight, no one had seen what had happened to me. That was what I thought, until I went into the shop to find the two shopkeepers hysterically laughing and to make matters worse they said “what just happened to you is so funny and we have it on our security camera.” If that was not embarrassing enough, they then told me that they were thinking of sending the footage to a TV show which shows recordings of funny and embarrassing things that happen to people.

The gentleman in the first story may not have been distracted, perhaps he was not able to see as clearly as he thought, whereas I was so intent on getting a good look at that very attractive object in the shop window that I was unaware of the proximity of the glass until it interfaced with my head.

The truth is that there are many things which have been deliberately placed in our way to distract us from clearly seeing the things which God would have us learn and understand. Very often we see clearly what the Lord wants us to do but the distractions of this life, usually get in the way and displaces the sense of urgency which should be characteristics of everyone who believes that we are living in the last days of the history of the earth.

The thought came to me of just how dependant we are. We usually think of children as being dependant and say when they grow-up they will be independent, but are adults truly independent?

Prophecy at its best!

Daniel chapter eleven is one of the most detailed prophetic chapters in the bible. Like chapters 2, 7 and 8 succeeding ruling world empires are outlined, that effected God's people. Each of the chapters start from the point in history when Daniel was writing and continues the repeat end enlarge system with extra details until the end.

The second verse in this fourth vision starts in the kingdom of Medo-Persia prophesying that there would be three more kings, then a richer fourth king. After Cyrus, the three kings of Persia were Cambyses, false or pseudo Smerdes and Darius Hystapes. The fourth king mentioned in this verse was Xeres who was far richer than all the others and was the first to try to conquer Greece but was defeated.

Verse 3 mentions the appearance of a mighty king which would rule. This was Alexander the Great who represented Greece. As prophesied, at the height of his rule he died and eventually four of his generals divided the kingdom. Just as the bible said none of Alexanders sons reigned.

From verse 5 onwards in this chapter there are references to the king of the North and the king of the South. The king of the North refers to the one who rules Babylon (Syria) and the king of the South refers to the one who rules over Egypt.

Verses 6 to 15 describes the various wars and alliances between the kings of the North and South. There was also a push at that time to force Greek culture and religion on all people.

In this chapter from verse 16 onwards Rome began to rise as a major empire. Rome conquered Syria and by an alliance it then became involved in the Holy lands and with the Jews (God's people). As Rome expanded it increased the size of the empire.

Some other key information in chapter 11 refers to some of the rulers of Rome. In verse 20 it was prophesied that one Roman ruler would tax the people. From history and in Luke 2 we read about the time when Caesar Augustus decreed that all the world should be taxed. It was during this time that Jesus was born.

From the gospels we also read about the crucifixion of Jesus which occurred under the reign of Caesar Tiberius. This was prophesied in Daniel 11:22.

In Daniel 11:23 onwards we see fighting, wars, leagues and alliances between Rome and the various nations including Egypt. Just as prophesied in verses 23 to 25 there was a league forged between Rome and the Jews until the Romans became an empire that had dominated the world.

After the domination of the world by pagan Rome, there was then an amalgamation of paganism and Christianity. This was once again covered in detail in the prophecy. The outcome of this amalgamation was that of Papal Rome.

Generally, the parts of the chapter outlined in this summary are only some of the major points of the chapter. There are other numerous details which are significant and worth exploring if you want to understand the various transitions of kingdoms from Medo-Persia until the end of time.

Daniel chapter 11 can best be summarised by Daniel 2:20-22 in which we are told that God raises up and removes kings. Everything is done in His time and in His way. Another important point about this chapter is that although the things prophesied in this chapter were extremely detailed, history has proved how accurate and true God is.

John 14:29 And now I have told you before it come to pass, that, when it is come to pass, ye might believe. What a mighty God we serve (KJV).

As we have already met Abraham and Elijah, let us continue with our journey in exploring other bible characters.

SAMSON

A Nazarite by birth, as instructed to his parents by God. Judges 13:1-5. The parents did their best to raise the child to be a judge in his adulthood.

Samson was solely dedicated to be the man to rescue his nation from the bullies, the Philistines. God made it possible for the lad to grow in the stature fit for the purpose.

The physical strength embedded in the man was so enormous that it was unfathomable to humanity. It has never been matched by any man since. He was a superhero to his own kind.

In all his dealings with physical challenges and at one point a lion, (Judges 14:5-6), he depended on God for strength. He fought many battles and was never defeated. Imagine the jaw bone of an ass with which he slew the 1000 Philistines.

The Israelites were spared from slavery as he stood up for them until the day he slipped!. Judges 16:4. Delilah was the cause of his downfall. Beauty? Charm?. Were there no charming beauties among the Israelites? Judge 14 : 1-3.

After being tricked by this precious woman of his, (Judges 16:5-17), he gave in and sold out his secret. His hair was shaved and he became like straw.

He suffered the consequences of his disobedience but God is full of compassion. In the end he killed more of his rivals on his death than he did when alive. Judges 16; 30-31.

DAVID

A man after God's own heart. Acts 13:22. King David was much favoured by God in so many ways. Although his background was not so impressive, (1 Samuel 17:15,34) a shepherd, God's mercies followed him wherever he went and in whatever his hands found to do.

As a good musician, he was chosen to play for the king before he became king himself. 1 Samuel 16:16 -19.

In King David's palace nothing was missing except contentment. Being a king chosen by God means more than one can anticipate, for all his needs were readily available. He had livestock mansions, wives, concubines you name it. He still wanted more!. 2 Samuel 12:7- 9.

At one point, David chose to take matters into his own hands. He decided to make provision for himself using his authority misusing the honour given to him. Lust brought him down. BATHSHEBA!

A married woman and the wife of his faithful soldier Uriah (2 Samuel 11:11) was brought to his chamber at his command merely to fulfil his heart's desires? 2 Samuel 11: 2-5. 1 Kings 1:28
Blood was shed to cover up the mess he got himself into, Uriah was killed mercilessly. 2 Samuel 11:15 - 17.

Punishment was announced by God's prophet Nathan. The baby of Bathsheba died and the sword never departed from David's household. 2 Samuel 12: 10 - 12.

The God of forgiveness did it again. He forgave David. 2 Samuel 12: 24 -25. Solomon was born to him, a consolation and a sign of God's forgiveness and mercy.

SOLOMON

The wisest and richest king who ever lived. 1 Kings 10:1 - 7.
He was chosen by God to build the temple. 1 Chronicles 28: 6.

Kings and queens came from afar to admire his glory and to learn from him.

Solomon's parents' history did not hold him back. He started very well in his spiritual journey. His apparel was of a distinct class, it's only the lilies that could out dress him. Matthew 6:28 - 29.

The most difficult cases were brought to him and he needed not to consult the soothsayers. He had God to mentor him. The case of the two women who shared accommodation and both had babies but one baby died and the other lady wanted to steal the live baby, was judged as plainly as one can see a reflection in the mirror. 1 kings 3: 16 - 27.

He was a good poet as well, Songs of Solomon and other chapters in the bible testify to this. He was familiar with love and sweet talking too. Songs of Solomon 1:15.

As the others he too missed a point in life. He fell in the hands of women to the extent that idols were permitted in his household. At this point he was unable to discern evil and good. Women, women and more women, this was Solomon's life. 1 Kings 11: 1- 5.

God is always merciful. Today we still study Solomon's good works and history in the Holy Bible.

Delilah continued to ask Samson for the secret of his strength. He said that if bound in new rope he would lose his strength. Delilah bound him with new rope when he was asleep.

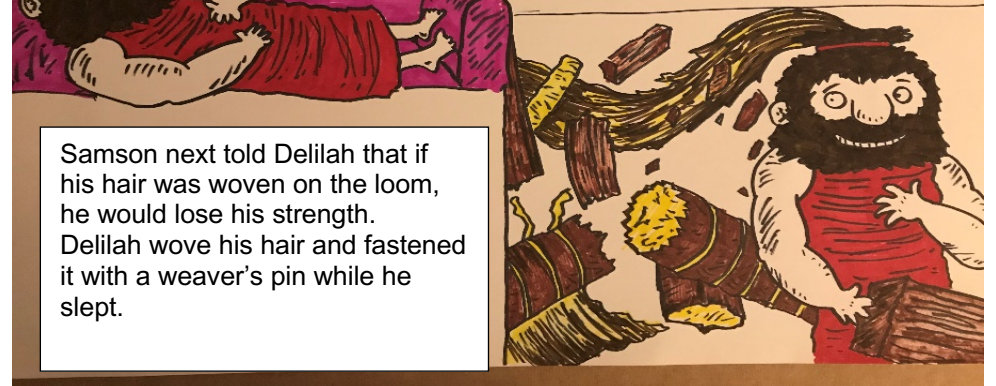


When Delilah said to him, "The Philistines be upon thee Samson" Samson broke the ropes off his arms like

Fear of the Lord

The Bible dictionary informs us that our modern word “fear” is the translation from various Greek and Hebrew words which, must have originally emphasized varying degrees of fear, the exact shade or degree of which, would need to be determined from the context.

For example the Hebrew words “yara” which means “to fear”, or “pachad” “to tremble” “to dread” . Similarly, the Greek word “phobeomai” “to fear” with the noun “phobos”. (that sounds to me as though that could be the root word for our word phobia – an extreme, abnormal, intense and irrational fear of a given situation, organism, or object. Collins English Dictionary)

Fear of the Lord - refers to a specific sense of respect, awe, and submission to a deity.

It is suggested that the term could mean fear of God’s Judgment, but an additional thought is that it encompasses much more than simple fear, embracing, awe, reverence, adoration, honour, worship, confidence, thankfulness and love.

The bible KJV - in Proverbs 8:13 says “The Fear of The Lord is to hate evil: pride and arrogancy and the evil way and the forward mouth do I hate.” In Proverbs 9: 10 we are told, “The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom and the knowledge of the Holy is understanding.

Reviewing these two bible verses in the light of the above information it would appear that we could accept that “The Fear of The Lord” is in fact not fear as we know it, but more to do with shunning the wrong and loving the right. Righteousness – The state in which a right relationship exists between man and God.

We could then look at the following bible text and see if we could come up with a satisfactory answer by using two other bible texts.

Psalm 34:11 Come ye children harken unto me: I will teach you the fear of the Lord.

We would then teach the children using the following texts, telling them HOW to fear the Lord. That is by loving Him and keeping His commandments, obeying Him.

Deuteronomy 11:1 Therefore, thou shall love the Lord thy God, and keep His charge, and His statutes, and His judgements, and His commandments, always.

Then we would need to explain WHY we should “Fear The Lord” (Love and Serve Him) and that is because He first loved us, to the extent of sending His Son to die for us while we were yet sinners.

Romans 5:8 But God commendeth His love towards us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us

There are many more texts on this subject but Deuteronomy 6:2 and 8:6 are also worthy of attention.

Sweet Corn Fritters

½ Cup Chickpea flour

½ Cup Rice Flour

1ts Baking Powder

½ Cup Frozen Sweet Corn if Canned pat dry

½ Cup Onion finely chopped

1 tsp Parsley

1 vegetable Oxo Cube

Salt pepper and seasonings to taste

Non stick frying pan, wire rack

- Mix all dry ingredients together including herbs and spices.
 - Add the onion and sweet corn and mix thoroughly
 - Let this mixture sit for 10 minutes then add cold water 1 tbs at a time until the mix just holds together.
 - Preheat the frying pan and wipe round with 1 tsp cooking oil
 - Place separated table spoons of the mixture in the frying pan.
 - Cook on a medium heat.
 - Fry until golden brown and flip over
 - Remove from the frying pan and place on the cooling wire, to preserve crisp texture
- Try using different vegetables like mixed vegetables, peas
- Serve as a side dish or as a part of a light meal
