The Book of Daniel

Have you read the book of Daniel lately, well if you have you would see what a wonderful book it really is. Well let's start at the beginning and see what we can learn from chapter 1.

3. No matter what circumstances we find ourselves in we can still witness. (Matthew 28:19,20).

In conclusion may we all remain faithful until Jesus comes.

THE STORY OF JOSEPH (part 1)

In Genesis 37, we learn a bit of Joseph's biography.

Life turned upside down dramatically as an innocent lad, Joseph, got sold for a slave to Medianites (vs27-29). He was not sold only once but twice, from the Medianites to Potiphar. (Gen. 37:36).

All this time God was with Joseph.

Things went back to "normal" except that he was still a slave. Potiphar put Joseph in charge of all his household and everything that belonged to him except his wife.

In chapter 39, Potiphar's wife sharp eyes grasped something special in Joseph which Potiphar's eyes missed, his beauty, and this got the boy into trouble. He was put in jail.

God's hand of mercy was still upon Joseph. Although in prison, his cup of blessings was continuously flowing over and I believe that he was immersed in God's favours for he was put in charge of other prisoners.

On one occasion, the two prisoners narrated their dreams to Joseph and by the power of God the dreams were revealed to him. He then made the dreams clear to the prisoners.

present himself neatly before the king, Gen 41: His dignity was restored once again and this time he was In a higher position for the world to see. He was made, Minister of Agriculture.


Ten Name Chain

Recipe

Lentil Soup

- 2 Medium Carrots
- 2 Sticks of Celery
- 2 Small Onion
- 1 medium Leek
- 1 Clove of Garlic
- Cup of Lentils thoroughly washed and rinsed
- Vegetable stock cube
- 3 or 4 Green Cardamom pods Seeds only

1tsp Cumin

- 1/2 tsp Medium curry powder
- 1/2 tsp Cayenne pepper

Salt to taste

- 1. Chop the onion (I prefer to chop mine finely as this soup is not pureed) and add to the saucepan dry fry until completely cooked without colour.
- 2. Peel and chop the carrots and chop the celery and leeks and add to the pan with the onions.
- 3. Finely chop or crush or grate garlic and add to the pan and stir.
- 4. Stir in the seeds of the cardamom, the cumin, curry powder, cayenne and stock cube. Continue to cook and stir until they release their perfume.
- 5. Add the lentils and stir.
- 6. Add enough boiling water to cover the ingredients and simmer gently for 20-25 minutes.
- 7. Check and add more water until the soup is the desired consistency.

Serve with warm bread or as a starter for a light supper. This is a basic recipe which can be altered to make a variety of soups. Why not add canned or cooked butter beans or other pulses. Try adding quinoa, couscous, or bulgur wheat instead of lentils. Vary the vegetables to use what you have in your fridge.
